While at the San Francisco Conservatory he participated in numerous master classes by leading composers, including John Adams, and also attended the European American Musical Alliance in Paris, France, where he studied with composer Narcis Bonet. After graduating from the San Francisco Conservatory Daniel began studying organ under the direction of Simon Berry and served as organ scholar at St. Dominic's Catholic Church in San Francisco. At Eastman Daniel was awarded the Gerald Barnes Prize for excellence in pipe organ and was recently awarded Third Prize in the National Young Artist Competition in Organ Performance at the 2018 National Convention for the American Guild of Organists. Daniel is currently director of music at St. John's Episcopal Church in Canandaigua, New York.
